

COOPERATIVE EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (CESP)

This is how the **CESP** works:

1. The selected establishment provides funds to the College for partial payment of the students' tuition fees (**\$10,000** for Advanced Diploma Program, and **\$11,250** for Commercial cookery Program).
2. The selected establishment commits itself to provide 800 hours per year of industry placement for the students they accept.
3. The student commits herself/ himself to fulfil her industry placement in that establishment for a period of 800 hours.

To obtain a place in the **CESP**, Kenvale College will make three attempts to place students in the industry establishment. After this process, if a student is unsuccessful they may retain a place at the College as a non-scholarship student with their own employment arrangement.

Some placements may require students to work early or late shifts. In such an event students will need to make suitable travel arrangements. Students leaving the scholarship program before completion of the required hours will need to pay the remaining fees for that semester.

An on-going monitoring and feedback mechanism is in place to ensure that students receive training and are rostered sufficiently. Upon completion of the first year of industry placement, students may opt for the following options once approved by the establishment and the College management:

- Remain in the same establishment (Increasing your chances of promotion).
- Try another establishment also offering a scholarship placement
- Leave the scholarship program and seek your own work in the industry. You will need prior notice and agreement from the establishment and the College

The **CESP** is only intended to cover partially students' tuition fees. Students may need additional financial support to cover other expenses such as travel, accommodation, uniforms, textbooks, etc. Full time students domestic may be eligible for Youth Allowance, Rent Assistance or Austudy, and student concession for public transport.

Under the **CESP**, students are not considered employees and as such they are not part of the award system. **CESP** students are not entitled to Workers Compensation, paid leave or other employee benefits. Students are covered by the College's Personal Accident Insurance Policy.
