

INDUSTRY PLACEMENT FOR COMMERCIAL COOKERY STUDENTS

All students following full time programs at **Kenvale College** are required to gain experience in the hospitality and events industry. This practical component runs concurrently with lectures. Students are expected to complete 800 hours of industry experience each year (an average of 20 – 25 hours of work per week throughout the year, allowing for a minimum of four weeks holiday – taken during breaks between semesters).

Students have the following options to achieve this requirement:

1. Students organise their own employment to complete their industry placement hours. The place and type of work need to be approved by the College.
2. Students participate in the Cooperative Education Scholarship Program (CESP).

The Cooperative Education Scholarship Program

The CESP is an exclusive agreement between Kenvale College and various industry establishments. This program offers students with little or no prior experience, the opportunity of finding a placement in order to fulfil their industry placement required for the year.

The Program is only intended to cover partially students' tuition fees. Under the CESP, students are not considered employees and as such are not part of the award system. They are covered by the College's Personal Accident Insurance Policy instead of receiving entitlement to Workers Compensation for accidents or injuries at the workplace.

Kenvale College will make three attempts to place students in participating Establishments. After this process, if a student is unsuccessful he/she may retain a place at the College as a non-scholarship student with his/her own employment arrangement.
